## Afterwards. An experiential history of the Holocaust 1945 – 1949

25 – 27 January 2015, dbb forum berlin, Friedrichstraße 169/170

The years immediately following the war played a decisive role in shaping the perception of the mass crimes of National Socialism. For the Allied soldiers who liberated the concentration camps, the horror at the images of emaciated inmates and piles of corpses was a dominant factor in their films and reports. For the inmates who were fortunate enough to survive the final weeks of SS domination, their lives were saved yet the future was still uncertain. In the years directly after the war, the German people were confronted with the crimes committed by the National Socialist regime in different ways. Last but not least, the years following the end of the war were also decisive for the perpetrators attempts to escape punishment for their deeds. Many who had not been interned by the Allies attempted to go into hiding or to flee the country. At the same time, the Allied victors were faced with the immense problem of how to deal with the German people as a whole. The years following the war were therefore a key time for the experiential history of the Holocaust. It was then that the first reports of the horrors were set down, the first dreadful images from the concentration camps widely shown and a number of high-ranking perpetrators were put on trial before the world.

Given that the National Socialist crimes had been committed in the years directly preceding them, the period 1945 to 1949 can be seen as a kind of laboratory for coming to terms with the Holocaust – one that is particularly worth exploring in detail today. Especially since so many pictures and stories about the Holocaust today seem to be fixed and shape our view of National Socialist crimes, looking closely at these years is useful in examining these direct experiences, images and reports, in coming to terms with the atrocities that were seen and heard for the first time in those years.

Within the framework of the 5th International Conference on Holocaust Research "Afterwards. An experiential history of the Holocaust 1945 – 1949" from 25 to 27 January 2015 in Berlin, concepts and models that deal with the translation of academic findings into practical educational work both within and outside schools will be presented in a project exhibition. In addition, on 25 January several practical projects will be presented in the conference's plenary session.

and Humboldt University of Berlin are calling for proposals for exemplary and innovative education projects dealing with the subject of the 5th International Conference on Holocaust Research "Afterwards. An

The winning projects will be presented on 25 and 26 January 2015 at dbb forum, Friedrichstraße 169/170, 10117 Berlin (exhibition and/or presentation). Notification of participation will be given by 10 December 2014.

Wanted

Creative and innovative projects and teaching methods (exhibitions, film productions, teaching material,

toolkits, brochures, training etc.), establishing a link to the theme "Afterwards. An experiential history of the Holocaust 1945 – 1949." This can concern all measures for education both within and outside of schools for

young people and adults with methods from different areas such as memorial work, film work, cultural and

intercultural education. We are particularly interested in projects that establish a connection between an examination of the Holocaust and the transfer of findings to political-historical education work today.

The winners

Those responsible for outstanding projects will be invited to present their project to a wide specialist audience

during the conference in a plenary session with a short Powerpoint presentation (5 minutes) and/or to present their project with a poster in the project exhibition. bpb will pay travel costs for up to two project managers

based on the "General terms and conditions for assumption of travel costs". Meals and drinks will be provided with conference catering.

**Conditions of participation** 

Institutes, educational establishments, NGOs, initiatives, memorial sites and individuals from Europe may participate who have carried out corresponding projects or developed materials. Projects that are in the

development stage or not yet completed are also eligible for entry.

All applications must be made using the enclosed questionnaire. Supplementary materials such as

information brochures or links to film or video material are desirable. The project description must clearly show which methodical, didactic and/or artistic elements characterise the outstanding character and

educational value of the project or approach for communication in educational practice.

The closing date for entries is 18 November 2014.
